

#### **STUDENT WELLNESS AND COVID UPDATE (Aug.31, 2022)**

As you may be aware, the Ontario Chief Medical Officers of Health (CMOH) has recently provided <u>updated COVID-19</u> guidance and has updated <u>the COVID-19 School Screener to include new symptoms and next steps.</u> The latest screener is dated August 31, 2022.

**Stay home when sick** – If your child has any new or worsening symptoms of any illness they should stay home until they don't have a fever, their symptoms have been improving for at least 24 hours (or 48 hours for nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea) and they aren't developing new symptoms. This includes if they test positive for COVID-19. There are no longer any standard isolation periods.

If you are unsure if your child should stay home, <u>follow the guidance in the updated COVID-19 School</u> <u>Screener</u>. Please ensure that you are using the version of the screener that was updated on August 31, 2022.

**Take additional precautions** – For 10 days following the onset of COVID-19 symptoms or a positive COVID-19 test (including if the person is asymptomatic) individuals should:

+ Wear a mask in all public settings (including school and child care).

+ Avoid non-essential activities where mask removal is necessary (for example, playing a wind instrument in music class or removing a mask for sports, dining out).

Household contacts of individuals with symptoms of COVID-19 or a positive COVID-19 test are also recommended to take the same precautions.

Please know that we will rely on our families and older students to follow this guidance and know when they will need to wear a mask at school. School staff will not be able to track individual masking timelines.

Our schools will continue to do what we can to provide physically healthy environments for students by promoting hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette, having hand sanitizer at different locations within our schools and continuing with enhanced cleaning protocols.

If you have questions about your family and COVID-19, please contact your public health unit directly for advice.

<u>Leeds</u>, <u>Grenville & Lanark District Health Unit</u> – Is advising families to complete the COVID-19 school screening and follow the next steps and/or call the provincial testing and isolation information line at 1-888-777-0730.

#### **ELECTRONICS & CELL PHONES**

If your child brings a device to school, it is imperative your child understand that video recording other students on the bus, school yard, bathrooms or at school is not permitted to protect the privacy of other students. We ask for your assistance in reinforcing this message.



Students who wish to call or text home during the day may do so during break times at the office. This helps ensure we are aware of any problems or changes that arise during the day.

Cell phones, watches and all recording devices must remain locked in lockers at arrival and used with teacher direction. Thank you

#### MEDICAL INFORMATION

Children with life threatening or other medical concerns require an updated Plan of Care. Please ensure you have connected with the office to complete a plan with our admin team. Any child requiring medication to be administered at school requires a signed Authorization form. All medication must be stored in our lock cabinet at school and should not travel to and from school with our students.

Our Bullying Prevention and Intervention Plan is updated annually and posted on our South Branch Website.


Our first meeting will be in October prior to our monthly Parent Council Meeting. A separate Teams links will be sent to invite you to attend both meetings.
